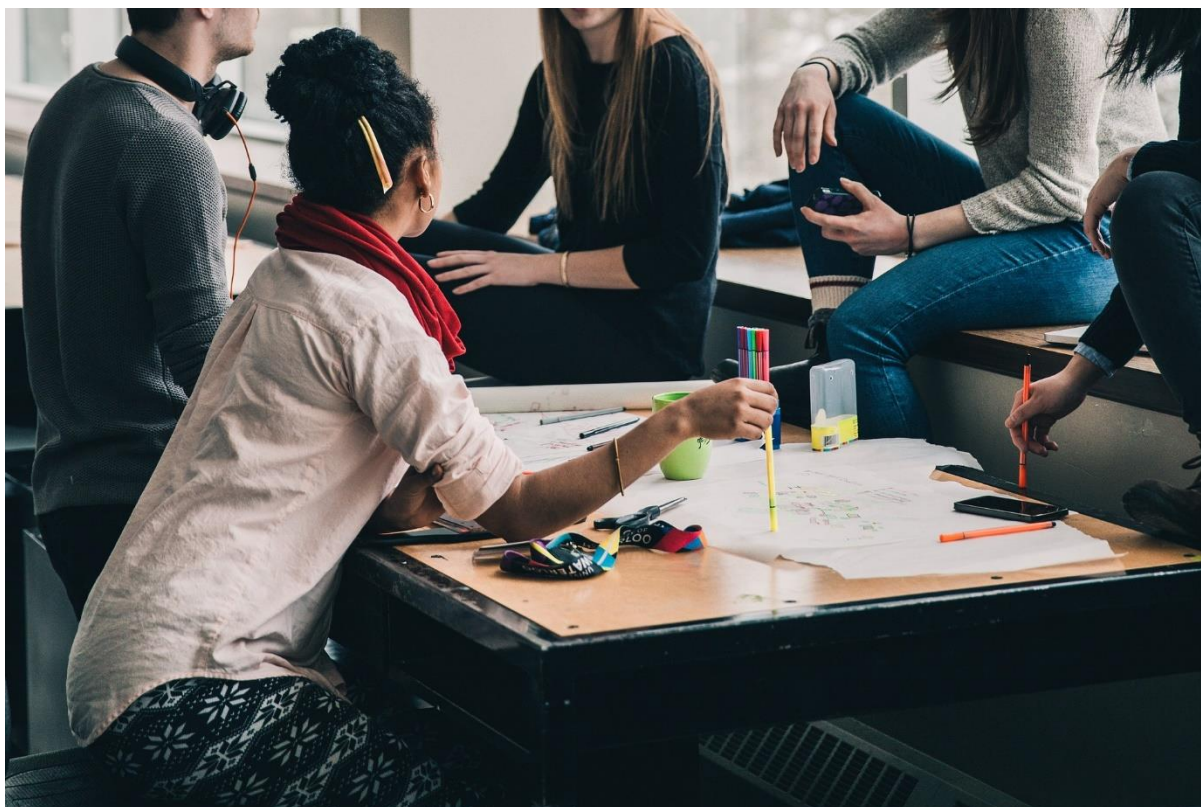


## Volunteer Opportunity to Join the RAP Committee
